



ISLP Poster Competition 2012–2013 Rules

Who can take part?

- Teams of 2–3 students (we do not allow posters made by only one student)
- Two divisions:
 - students born in 1997 and younger (upper comprehensive school)
 - students born in 1994 and younger (upper secondary school)
- Students may only take part in one team and make one poster
- Posters must be submitted by teachers to country coordinators (<http://www.stat.auckland.ac.nz/~iase/islp/people>)
- Free entry

When?

- National competitions
 - Posters submitted to ISLP country coordinators
 - National winners announced

country dependent
29th March 2013 (at the latest)
- International competition
 - Prizes awarded at 59th ISI World Statistics Congress 2013 in Hong Kong, China

25–30th August 2013

Posters

- Posters can be about any topic students choose within the general theme – Agriculture (for example, agriculture and domesticated animals/food/industry/urban development etc.)
- Data used can be collected by students or previously published by someone else (if the data is published, the source must be cited in the poster)
- Posters can be in any language
- Posters must not contain any information about students or schools that prepared them
- Posters from previous international competitions are not allowed
- Posters must be the original design and creation of students
- Posters must be two-dimensional (one single sheet) and one-sided: maximum size is A1 (841 mm x 594 mm or 33.1 in x 23.4 in) and maximum file size is 2 MB
- All entries become the property of the ISI and cannot be returned
- By submitting a poster, students give permission for their work to be displayed at various ISI conferences, special events, in publications and promotional material, and in electronic format on the internet
