



ISLP Poster Competition 2014–2015 Rules

Who can take part?

- Teams of 2–3 students (we do not allow posters made by only one student)
- Two divisions:
 - students born in 1999 and younger (lower secondary or upper comprehensive school)
 - students born in 1996 and younger (upper secondary school)
- Students may only take part in one team and make one poster
- Posters must be submitted by teachers to country coordinators for entry in National Competition (http://iase-web.org/islp/People.php?p=Country_Coordinators)
- Free entry

When?

- National competitions
 - Posters submitted to ISLP country coordinators country dependent
 - National winners announced 14.3.2015 (at the latest)
- International competition
 - Prizes awarded at 60th ISI World Statistics Congress Rio de Janeiro, Brazil 2015 26–31 July 2015

Posters

- Posters can be about any topic. However, posters should reflect or illustrate usage, analysis, interpretation and communication of statistics or statistical information and findings. In planning the projects on which posters are based, it is important to take into account the judging rules of the ISLP Poster Competition, which clarify these educational goals.
- Data used can be collected by students or previously published by someone else (if the data is published, the source must be cited in the poster)
- Posters can be in any language
- Posters must be blind i.e. they must not contain any information about students or schools who have submitted them
- Posters from previous international competitions are not allowed
- Posters must be the original design and creation of students
- Posters must be two-dimensional (one single sheet) and one-sided: maximum size is A1 (841 mm x 594 mm or 33.1 in x 23.4 in) and maximum file size is 10 MB
- All entries become the property of the ISI and will not be returned
- By submitting a poster, students give permission for their work to be displayed at various ISI conferences, special events, in publications and promotional material, and in electronic format on the internet
